How to enrol your child

Enrolments can be made online. You will need to provide proof of identity for the student. Proof of identity can be shown using a birth certificate or passport. Proof of residential address eg council rates notice, residential lease, electricity accounts, statutory declaration etc. Children may not start school until an enrolment application process is complete. Children beginning Kindergarten, will also need an Immunisation Certificate. More information can be found here:

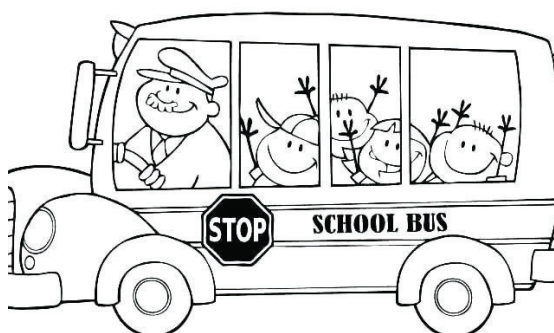

School Bus

Our school has a dedicated bus service to bring your child to school. This bus services Kurrajong Heights and only Kurrajong North students use the bus.

Please label your child's belongings

Lost property is very hard to identify if it is not properly labelled. Names written in permanent marker on tags or commercially printed name-tags sewn securely will ensure that your child does not lose valuable clothing. Lunch boxes, drink bottles, art shirts, cups and toys need to be labelled as well.

School Hats

As part of our Sun Safe policy children are required to wear a school hat with a wide brim. Children without a hat must remain in the shade. Hats can be purchased from the school.

Medications

Children needing regular prescription medication are not to keep tablets or any other form of medication in their bags. If your child requires medication to be administered at school please obtain a medication authorisation form from the school office.

Accident/Sickness

In the event of an accident or illness it is essential that you can be contacted. The school should be notified immediately of any changes in contact details.

Sentral for Parents

We have a school app called Sentral for Parents. We can communicate with you through this app and you will be able to submit absences and book parent/teacher interviews when available. You can download Sentral for Parents through your app store.

Student Assistance Scheme

The school receives a limited amount of funding each year to assist families who are experiencing difficulties paying for excursions, uniforms etc. If you require assistance, please contact the Principal.

Religious Instruction

Roman Catholic, Anglican and Ethics classes are conducted once a week on Tuesdays. Please notify the school which scripture class (or Non Scripture class) you would like your child to attend.

Late Arrivals and Early Departures

If you arrive late to school, please go to the office and sign your child in to the Late Arrivals/Early Leavers book. Similarly, if you are taking your child from school early, you need to go to the school office and sign your child out in the Late Arrivals/Early Leavers book. You will then be given a slip to give to your child's teacher.

Absences

It is really important that children attend school each day. However, if your child is absent from school, please send a note to school with them when they return. Please let the school know if your child is to be away for more than a few days. If it is to be a prolonged absence e.g. going on holidays, please let the school know beforehand. Our Sentral for Parents app can also be used for absence notifications.



Best Start

Before formally beginning Kindergarten each new Kindergarten child will be involved in an individual **"Best Start Kindergarten Assessment"**.

This is not a test but an opportunity for the Kindergarten teacher to observe each child on an individual basis as they undertake tasks in literacy and numeracy. It will help the teacher understand what your child already knows as they begin their formal schooling.

The teacher will look at your child's reading and writing, their ability to communicate with others and how they recognise and work with numbers, groups and patterns.

You will be given feedback about what your child's teacher has learned about your child.

School Fees

The school does not ask parents to pay school fees. Instead we ask that parents cover the cost of materials such as text books and yearly subscription costs for interactive online learning. This cost is approximately \$80.

Excursions

Children who are participating in cultural visits, school excursions, camps and sporting activities are required to have a signed permission note from their parents. Please bear in mind that if a permission note has not been received by the class teacher or at the office, your child cannot participate in the activity.

Payments for excursions etc. can be made online via the school website. There is a school mail box near the main office where you can post payments and permission notes. There are also envelopes available if you require one. Please make sure you put your child's name and what the payment is for on the front of the envelope. Should you become concerned about your child's education, contact the school at any time and make an appointment to discuss the issue.

Formal Reporting to Parents

Formal interviews with your child's teacher regarding your child's progress are held at the end of Term 2.

School reports give parents information about your child and provide feedback on how much students have achieved throughout the year.

Written reports will be sent home to parents at the end of Term 2 and Term 4. We encourage parents to discuss their child's report with their child.

Canteen

There is a great Tuckshop every Friday at the school - run by volunteer parents on a roster system. Lunch is usually a set menu for that week and an order form is sent home each week.

If you would like to assist with our Friday Tuckshop, please notify the office as all help is gratefully accepted.

Sport

Sport is conducted by a "Sporting Schools" coach. All children participate in this activity and should wear sports attire. We also offer additional sporting programs such as gymnastics and dance. These are provided by outside accredited agencies and can run for a few weeks or a term. If your child is unable to participate in sport for reasons of illness or injury, please indicate this in a note to the class teacher.

Sending Money to School

When it becomes necessary to send money to school for excursions and other activities, the money should be sent with the appropriate permission note/order form in an envelope. Please put the child's name, class, function and the amount enclosed.

The school accepts cash, EFTPOS and cheque payments. There is a mail box located at the front office where you can post any payments and permission notes. Credit card payments can be made online via the school website:

Too sick for school?



Generally if your child feels unwell, keep them home from school and consult your doctor. This chart and the information it contains is not intended to take the place of a consultation with your doctor.

| Bronchitis | Symptoms are coughing, a runny nose, sore throat and mild fever. The cough is often dry at first, becoming moist after a couple of days. There may be a slight wheeze and shortness of breath. A higher fever (typically above 39°C) may indicate pneumonia. |  ... until they are feeling better. Antibiotics may be needed. |
| Chickenpox (Varicella) | Slight fever, runny nose, and a rash that begins as raised pink spots that blister and scab. |  ... for 5 days from the onset of the rash and the blisters have dried. |
| Conjunctivitis | The eye feels 'scratchy', is red and may water. Lids may stick together on waking. |  ... while there is discharge from the eye unless a doctor has diagnosed a non-infectious cause. |
| Diarrhoea (no organism identified) | Two or more consecutive bowel motions that are looser and more frequent than normal and possibly stomach cramps. |  ... for at least 24 hours after diarrhoea stops. |
| Fever | A temperature of 38.5°C or more in older infants and children. |  ... until temperature is normal. |
| Gastroenteritis | A combination of frequent loose or watery stools (diarrhoea), vomiting, fever, stomach cramps, headaches. |  ... for at least 24 hours after diarrhoea and/or vomiting stops. |
| German measles (Rubella) | Often mild or no symptoms: mild fever, runny nose, swollen nodes, pink blotchy rash that lasts a short time. |  ... for at least 4 days after the rash appears. |
| Glandular Fever (Mononucleosis, EBV infection) | Symptoms include fever, headache, sore throat, tiredness, swollen nodes. |  ... unless they're feeling unwell. |
| Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD) | Generally a mild illness caused by a virus, perhaps with a fever, blisters around the mouth, on the hands and feet, and perhaps the nappy area in babies. |  ... until all blisters have dried. |
| Hayfever (Allergic rhinitis) caused by allergy to pollen (from grasses, flowers and trees), dust mites, animal fur or hair, mould spores, cigarette smoke | Sneezing, a blocked or runny nose (rhinitis), itchy eyes, nose and throat, headaches. |  ... unless they feel unwell or are taking a medication which makes them sleepy. |
| Head lice or nits* (Pediculosis) | Itchy scalp, white specks stuck near the base of the hairs; lice may be found on the scalp. |  ... while continuing to treat head lice each night. Tell the school. |

| Hepatitis A | Often none in young children; sudden onset of fever, loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting, jaundice (yellowing of skin and eyes), dark urine, pale stools. |  ... for 2 weeks after first symptoms (or 1 week after onset of jaundice). Contact your doctor before returning to school. | |
| Hepatitis B | Often no symptoms in young children. When they do occur, they can include fever, loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting, jaundice (yellowing of skin and eyes), dark urine. |  ... if they have symptoms. Contact your doctor before returning to school. |  ... if they have a chronic infection (not the first outbreak) and no symptoms. |
| Impetigo (School sores) | Small red spots change into blisters that fill up with pus and become crusted; usually on the face, hands or scalp. |  ... until antibiotic treatment starts. Sores should be covered with watertight dressings. | |
| Influenza | Sudden onset fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough, muscle aches and headaches. |  ... until well. | |
| Measles | Fever, tiredness, runny nose, cough and sore red eyes for a few days followed by a red blotchy rash that starts on the face and spreads down the body and lasts 4 to 7 days. |  ... for at least 4 days after the rash appears. | |
| Meningococcal Disease | Sudden onset of fever and a combination of headache, neck, stiffness, nausea, vomiting, drowsiness or rash. | Seek medical attention immediately. Patient will need hospital treatment. Close contacts receive antibiotics. | |
| Molluscum Contagiosum | Multiple small lumps (2–5mm) on the skin that are smooth, firm and round, with dimples in the middle. In children, occur mostly on the face, trunk, upper arms and legs. Symptoms can last 6 months to 2 years. |  | |
| Mumps | Fever, swollen and tender glands around the jaw. |  ... for 9 days after onset of swelling. | |
| Ringworm* (tinea corporis) | Small scaly patch on the skin surrounded by a pink ring. |  ... for 24 hours after fungal treatment has begun. | |
| Runny nose or common cold | |  ... unless there are other symptoms such as fever, sore throat, cough, rash or headache. Check with school. | |
| Scabies* | Itchy skin, worse at night. Worse around wrists, armpits, buttocks, groin and between fingers and toes. |  ... until 24 hours after treatment has begun. | |
| Shigella | Diarrhoea (which may contain blood, mucus and pus), fever, stomach cramps, nausea and vomiting. |  ... until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 24 hours. Antibiotics may be needed. | |
| Slapped Cheek Syndrome (Parvovirus B19 infection, fifth disease, erythema infectiosum) | Mild fever, red cheeks, itchy lace-like rash, and possibly cough, sore throat or runny nose. |  ... as it is most infectious before the rash appears. | |
| Whooping Cough (Pertussis) | Starts with a running nose, followed by persistent cough that comes in bouts. Bouts maybe followed by vomiting and a whooping sound as the child gasps for air. |  ... until the first 5 days of an antibiotic course has been completed. Unimmunised siblings may need to stay home too until treated with an antibiotic. | |
| Worms (Threadworms, pinworms) | The main sign of threadworms is an itchy bottom. Sometimes children feel 'out of sorts' and do not want to eat much. They may also have trouble sleeping, due to itching at night. |  ... and tell the school as other parents will need to know to check their kids. | |

***It is important that the rest of the family is checked for head lice, scabies and ringworm**
